SOUTH WEST WALES CHAMPION PLOUGHMEN

The South & West Wales 3-2-1 Presentation was held at the Fox & Hounds, Bancyfelin on Saturday 8th December 2018.

The 3-2-1 is a points system which gives 3 points to the match winner, 2 points to the second placed competitor and 1 point to the third placed ploughman across the 11 ploughing matches in the South West Wales area during the ploughing season.

The presentation was made to the Junior Champion, Morgan Evans, from West Gower Ploughing Society. The Senior Champion was Gordon Harries of South Pembs Ploughing Society, winning it for the second time.

Gordon will be ploughing for Wales in October competing in the European Vintage Ploughing Championships in Scotland in the Vintage Trailer Class.

NED & JACK AT BARLEY SATURDAY IN CARDIGAN!

Ceredigion ploughman John Fletcher and two of his plough horses Ned & Jack were leading lights at the 58th Annual Barley Saturday /Dydd Sadwrn Barlys in Cardigan earlier this year.



John Fletcher, with his pair of showstopping Shires, Ned and Jack, took part in the annual Barley Saturday Stallion Show and Parade held in Cardigan in June. This is a remarkable tradition that harks back to a bygone era and is believed to date back to the mid-19th Century. The event was originally held to celebrate the end of the spring barley sowing season, barley being the last cereal crop to be sown after wheat and oats. It provided a dual role of a half-yearly hiring season for farmers and landowners to hire workers for the Summer season as well as an opportunity for owners of stallions to display their animals. The current event was resurrected by organisers in 1961.

This year's event saw a parade of around 50 stallions and heavy horse turnouts plus a selection of vintage tractors through the streets of Cardigan. There is a competitive element to the day and John Fletcher with Ned & Jack was Supreme Champion in the Heavy Horse Turnout. Ned and Jack compete regularly in the High Cut Class at the All Wales Championships.

UPDATE ON 2020 ALL WALES CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 2020 Championships will be held in Monmouthshire next year at Llancayo Farm, Usk by kind invitation of the Morgan family. David Morgan MBE DL FRAgS (pictured far right at the Royal Welsh Show 2015) is a former President of the Royal Welsh Agricultural Society and a keen supporter of ploughing. Preparations are picking up with fundraising starting in earnest – the most recent event was a Promise Auction and Barbecue held last month and which raised over £5,500. A fundraising concert will be held at Usk Church in November featuring Monmouth Male Voice Choir. Usk Church will provide the venue for the Blessing of the Plough Service next year.





Y 60FED BENCAMPWRIAETH AREDIG & PHLYGU GWRYCH CYMRU GYFAN - 2019 THE 60TH ALL WALES PLOUGHING & HEDGING CHAMPIONSHIPS - 2019

This is the year that will see the Welsh Ploughing Association hosting the 60th All Wales Ploughing & Hedging Championships!

It is befitting for this milestone in the history of Cymdeithas Aredig Cymru / Welsh Ploughing Association that the Championships will return to a venue in mid-Wales that is familiar to those regularly competing at the Championships. This is Gwernygo Farm, in the village of Sarn near Newtown in Montgomeryshire, just inside the Welsh border.

Gwernygo Farm is situated in the picturesque Vale of Kerry and will provide some excellent ploughing ground with a good depth of medium loam soil. Ploughing will be on wheat stubble.

The date of the Championships is Saturday 21st September.

The hosts and joint Presidents of the Championships, Mr & Mrs Edward Gethin are hosting the Championships for the third time with the Championships having previously been held at this site in 1999 and 2009.


The Chairman of the organising committee is also a very familiar face, namely Meurig Jones, who is in this role for the third time as he was also Chairman on the previous two occasions that the Championships were held at Gwernygo Farm.

Secretary is Mary-Rose Hamer, wife of ploughman Cliff Hamer. Mary-Rose is Secretary for the first time and says that she is thoroughly enjoying the role. She recounts how she got involved with the organising committee: "I attended a couple of meetings really to discuss how we might bring in funding from Barclays Bank where I work and before I knew it, I'd been voted in as Secretary!" I am sure this has a familiar ring to many of us!

Much of the Committee's efforts have been focused on fundraising to stage the Championships which started in earnest around five years ago with two fundraising events being held every year, including concerts, hog roasts and barbecues and a promise auction at Gwernygo Farm that proved very successful raising in excess of £5,000. With most fundraising events completed, attention is now focused on securing sponsorship and preparations for the Championships.





SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

The schedule includes 10 tractor ploughing classes and two horse ploughing classes including a class for Classic Reversible Ploughs for the first time.

There is a strong tradition of hedging in Montgomeryshire and four hedging classes are available for Montgomeryshire Style (Open); Montgomeryshire (Intermediate); Any Other Style (Open) and Any Other Style (Under 26). Entry is free for competitors aged under 26. Competitions are rounded off with three classes for wire fencing: Open Pairs; Pair - Under 26 and Open (hand tools only).

Entries for all classes were due in by 1st August. However, the deadline has been extended to 14th August so, if you are very quick, there may be time for some last minute entries!

THE PLOUGHMEN & HEDGERS OF MONTGOMERYSHIRE

PART I The Ploughmen...

As Ellis Davies remarks in his book "Fifty Years of Welsh Ploughing", "Montgomeryshire has always had a strong tradition of quality ploughing which has produced its share of All-Wales... .. Champions". This continues to the present day with Montgomeryshire ploughmen continuing to make their mark at local, national and international level.

Mike Holloway



Mike has had a long and prolific career in ploughing, having started competition ploughing at the age of 13 in the late 1960s. Among his many successes, he was All Wales Champion in 1987 and 1988. Mike is the Local Field Director for this year's Championships.

Cemlyn Sheen

Cemlyn is another renowned Welsh ploughman who has been on the ploughing circuit for many years and competes in the Vintage Hydraulic Class. He is a member of the organising committee for this year's Championships.

Cliff Hamer

Cliff is at the heart of preparations for the 2019 Championships, as husband of Mary-Rose, the Local Secretary!

Cliff, from Dolwen near Llanidloes, is a relatively recent recruit to match ploughing, although ploughing is a key part of his working life as an agricultural contractor. Mary-Rose explains:

"Cliff never really had any hobbies, concentrating on work, but started match ploughing around 9 years ago, having been persuaded by Emlyn Jones." Cliff competes in the Vintage Hydraulic competitions and ploughed for Wales at the Six Nations Championships in 2018 where he achieved second place, just 8 points behind Emlyn Jones. At last year's All Wales Championships, he achieved a joint fourth place with none other than Emlyn Jones!

Emlyn is one of our leading Welsh ploughmen who competes in the Vintage Hydraulic Class and has achieved some impressive results over the years. Emlyn is from Trefeglwys near Caersws, just West of Newtown. He regularly features in the top five placings at the All Wales Championships and regularly qualifies to plough for Wales at the European Vintage Championships and the Six Nations Championships. One of his best results was in 2017 at the European Championships in Germany where he was placed first in his class and third in the overall Championships.

Evan is another leading Welsh ploughmen, representing Wales at the highest level at the World Contest in the World Style Conventional Ploughing Class for the past two decades. Evan is a Trustee of Cymdeithas Aredig Cymru / Welsh Ploughing Association and is a member of this year's Local Montgomeryshire Committee. As remarked upon above, the year 1999 marked the first occasion of three that the All Wales Championships was held at Gwernygo Farm and this Championships was also remarkable for another reason that it marked the occasion that Evan was crowned Champion of Wales for the first time, having been Reserve Champion in 1996 and 1998. This was the start of a run of six consecutive Championships titles and altogether, Evan has been Champion Welsh Ploughman on 12 occasions including in 2017 and 2018 – will he make 2019 the hat trick on home soil?

Evan has achieved tremendous success at the World Contest competing in all parts of the world, being runner-up twice and winning seven World Championships medals.

John Lewis

John lives in Meifod, a few miles as the crow files from Welshpool. John is another regular competitor in the ever-competitive Vintage Hydraulic Class at the All Wales Championships. He regularly features in the top five placings, achieving fifth place in 2017 and joint fourth with Afan Jones in 2016.

Sam also hails from that hotspot of competition ploughing, Trefeglwys near Caersws. Sam competes in the Vintage Trailer Class and is another regular competitor at the All Wales Championships who is usually to be found in the top placings. One of his best results was in 2015 when he won the Class by a massive margin of 26 points. He makes regular forays into international competition at the European Vintage Championships and Six Nations Championships and was part of the winning Welsh Team at the Six Nations last year.

Wales reigns supreme......

The Six Nations Championships returned to Wales in 2018 and was hosted by Newport, Nevern & Dinas Ploughing Society alongside their local match on 20th October at Awenfryn, Glanrhyd by kind permission of Messrs K and K Evans. Here follows a report by Gordon Harries:

"A lovely sunny morning welcomed all to a superb ploughing site. Some of the competitors and supporters enjoyed a hog roast and entertainment on the Friday night which was enjoyed by everyone.

The local committee was well organised and ran one of the best ploughing matches held in Wales during 2018. There were 21 competitors from Wales, England, Scotland,

Northern Ireland, Isle of Man and Northern Ireland. There were no competitors from the Republic of Ireland. There were a total of 60 competitors in both the Six Nations and the Newport, Nevern & Dinas Match.

The judges were Mr J Tucker, Mr A Williams, Mr N Cruikshank and Mr D Jones. Depth judge was Mrs G Bradley and Head Steward was Mr J Fletcher".

Wales enjoyed a tremendous day of success with Gordon Harries and Emlyn Jones being placed second and third respectively in the overall championship and Wales being crowned the top scoring country.

World Contest - Lake of the Woods, Minnesota, USA on 30th & 31st August

Champion Ploughman at the All Wales Championships in 2018 was Evan Watkin who was also selected to represent Wales at the World Contest. However, due to commitments with being part of the Local Committee for the 2019 All Wales Championships which follow three weeks later, Evan has reluctantly decided not to travel to the USA. Reserve Champion, Rhodri George, will step in to compete in his place in the Conventional Class. Rhodri will be accompanied by Hugh Griffith who will compete in the Reversible Class. Judge will be Aled Morgan and Coach Emrys Owen

European Vintage Ploughing Championships - Bowhouse Farm, St Monans, Fife, Scotland

The Championships will be hosted by the Scottish Ploughing Association alongside their National Ploughing Championships. Gordon Harries will be representing Wales in the Vintage Trailer Class, this will be for the 12th time. Tony Bradley is another veteran of the Championships, also representing Wales for the 12th time. The third representative is David Hankey in the Classic Class, representing Wales for the third time. Coach will be John Tucker and Steward Gill Bradley.

Six Nations Vintage & Classic Championships - Caradoc Court, Sellack, Ross-on-Wye, Herefordshire

The Championships will be run alongside the Llanwarne Ploughing Match in Herefordshire. It will be Sam Jones and Harry Williams who will be competing for Wales in the Trailer Class, Arthur Jennings and Cliff Hamer in the Hydraulic Class and Leighton Bryan and Ceri Richards in the Classic Class.

WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO RUN AN ALL WALES CHAMPIONSHIPS?

This is a question that many organising committees ask themselves!

Since the inception of the Welsh Ploughing Association in 1958, Wales has staged 59 annual Championships with the 60th taking place this year in Montgomeryshire.

In a series of articles, we will look at the elements of running an All Wales Ploughing & Hedging Championships and what it takes to run a national ploughing contest. In this first article, we will examine two of the three main resources needed, namely land and people! The third resource – money – will form the subject of the next article in this series.

The Site.....

Given that just 14% of the land area of Wales is capable of arable cropping, it is a minor miracle that we are able to continue to find sites for the Championships. In some areas, farmers are moving to "min till" techniques which removes the need to plough over arable land for the next crop which puts added pressure on finding sites.

That we are able to continue finding good sites for the Championships is testament to the enthusiasm of a number of farmers and landowners across Wales who are keen to support Welsh Ploughing and to see it thrive into the future. A good example of this is David Morgan who is supplying the site for the Championships in Monmouthshire in 2020. In a number of notable cases, certain landowners have supplied a site for a number of Championships. An example of this is the Gethin family who have provided a site at Gwernygo Farm at Sarn near Newtown on two occasions in 1999 and 2009 and will make it a hat trick this year providing the site at the same farm in 2019. We should not forget the Thomas family who hosted the Championships at Boverton Place Farm in the Vale of Glamorgan in both 2010 and 2017 and the Featherstonehaugh family in North Wales who provided an excellent accessible site at Kinmel Home Farm at Abergele in 1990 and again in 2013.

It is heartening that new sites also continue to come forward. Flintshire Farmers Ploughing Society is running the Championships in 2021 at a new site near Wrexham in North-East Wales kindly offered by Sir Watkin Williams-Wynn.

The Welsh Ploughing Association is indebted to the many hosts who have supplied land for the Championships over many years and ensuring that we have a continued pipeline of sites going into the future.

How much land is needed?

A question that is often asked and is dictated to a degree by the number of competitors which vary considerably but tend to number at least 100 and have been as high as 120 / 130. The acreage needed is also partly determined by the size and layout of fields and the number of windings that can be fitted in. Ideally around 90 acres of ploughing ground is needed. Most years, ploughing is on stubble but has been on grass on occasion – the Glamorgan match in 2017 is a recent example. On one memorable occasion in 2002, all of the ploughing plots were accommodated in one single field at Carrow Hill Farm in Monmouthshire which was a site to behold!

Additional land is needed to accommodate marquees, tradestands and carparking which tend to work best on grass but can be accommodated on stubble fields if necessary – the only downside is that conditions can get sticky if the weather is wet.

The Championships of course are not just about ploughing – an important part of the day are the hedging and fencing Championships. In some cases, hedges are simply not available on the site or there are hedges that have not been grown for laying. Where this is the case, Hafren Hedging Society has stepped in to host the All Wales Championships alongside their society match which has worked very well.

Forming an Organising Committee.....

Interestingly, different counties take a different approach to forming their local committee. The most common approach is for a local ploughing society to run the Championships using their existing committee. An example of this is Flintshire Ploughing Society who took on the mantle to run a Championships for the first time in the history of the Championships in 2013 under the chairmanship of Arthur Jennings. Margaret Jennings, who was the Local Secretary in that year, says "this approach worked for us as individual members stepped up and took on responsibility for different things e.g. someone organised road signage, someone else organised the bins and disposal of rubbish after the match and so on".

South Pembs are another capable ploughing society with a very small committee but made up of some experienced members who managed to raise the funds and organise the Championships within a 12 month period in 2015. Indeed Pembrokeshire is notable for its very capable and enthusiastic local ploughing societies which relish running a Championships. St David's Ploughing Society is one such example which has run the Championships on a number of occasions, mostly recently last year.

Another model worth considering and to spread the workload is for two clubs to combine to jointly run the Championships. This was an approach adopted by Llandygwydd YFC Ploughing Society and Cymdeithas Aredig Gogledd Ceredigion who joined forces to run the 2012 Championships. That year, there were joint Local Secretaries in the shape of Margaret Jones and Phyllis Harries.

A completely different approach is taken in Monmouthshire where a number of ploughing societies and vintage clubs have combined to form the Monmouthshire Local Committee. Current Chairman, Ray Bowen explains more: "When I was first involved with Monmouthshire hosting the All Wales Championships, the prospect of raising the considerable amount of money needed was to say the least daunting. However, for the 2011 Championships, we were fortunate to have five ploughing / vintage clubs on the organising committee who were keen to be involved. These clubs soon set out ideas to raise the funds but just as important were their spread of interests and contacts. When an idea was put forward, someone soon said "I know who can do that...." etc. The help in ways other than financial was critical in running a successful match. Since 2011, with occasional meetings and quiz nights, we have kept our committee together which has kept money trickling into our fundraising pot but, equally importantly, has given us a readymade committee already set up for the next Championships being hosted by Monmouthshire next year."

A similar approach was adopted by Breconshire which hosted the Championships in 2016 with its committee combined from members of Defynnog Vintage Society, Three Cocks Vintage Society, Rhosgoch Hedging Match, Radnor Valley Vintage Club and the Builth & District Ploughing & Hedging Society.

RON WILLIAMS – TRIBUTE BY TONY BRADLEY

Ron started his ploughing career at the age of 13 in local matches. His first Welsh match was in 1959 in Pembroke and he came first in the general purpose class against the trailer ploughs. He was Reserve Champion of Great Britain in 1960.

His next match at Welsh level was in 1961at Llancayo Farm, Usk in his home county of Monmouthshire which included a new class for hydraulic ploughs in which Ron took first place. It's ironic that the Welsh Championships will be held at Llancayo Farm again next year which Ron had been looking forward to and hoping that he would be well enough to compete in, unfortunately not to be.

In 1963, Ron became YFC Champion of Great Britain.

In 1966, the Welsh Championships was held in Brecon where Ron won his class and was crowned overall Champion of Wales.

Ron then took a break from ploughing but made a comeback at the Welsh Championships in 1992 where he was placed second in the Classic Class. This was followed by further success, placed third in 2002 in Monmouthshire (when he was also Vice-Chairman of the

organising committee) and first in 2003 when he also won the Monmouthshire Cup for the best ploughman from that county.

After ploughing on 17 occasions at the All Wales Championships, Ron retired from match ploughing and went on to judge in many local, national and European matches. He also judged at the All Wales Championships on many occasions and was a Master Judge twice, the second time in 2007.

Ron was not only a good ploughman and a good judge but also a good friend to so many and a good farmer. At the time of his passing, he was President of Llangattock Ploughing Society and had been instrumental in re-starting the Society in 1998 after a period of dormancy. We will all miss him.

TED GREEN MEMORIAL MATCH

The late Ted Green was a valued member of East Wales & Borders Vintage Enthusiasts and a keen ploughman who competed in many matches in Monmouthshire and Herefordshire during the ploughing season.

As a tribute to Ted, a ploughing match was held in March by his home club to raise funds for his family's chosen charity, the Royal Brompton Hospital in Chelsea, London. A total of 56 ploughmen took part despite the wet and windy weather conditions, travelling from near and far to honour the former member of East Wales and Borders Vintage Enthusiasts.

Overall Champion was Alwyn Davies whilst Barry Evans won the competition for the best turned out tractor and plough. The winner of the Ted Green Memorial Cup for the best work by a Club member was Allan Davies.
